A Resolution of the Common Council of the City of Crawfordsville, Indiana  
Recognizing the Staff and Supporters of the  
General Lew Wallace Study & Museum for  
Receiving the 2008 National Medal for Museum Service

WHEREAS, the City of Crawfordsville, through its Department of Parks & Recreation and the Lew Wallace Study Preservation Society Board of Trustees, owns and operates the General Lew Wallace Study & Museum;

WHEREAS, on October 7, 2008, the General Lew Wallace Study and Museum received the National Medal for Museum Service at a special ceremony at the White House hosted by First Lady Laura Bush attended by representatives of the Museum;

WHEREAS, the National Medal for Museum Service is the nation's highest honor for museums that make their communities better places to live and is awarded to only five out of 17,500 museums nationwide each year;




